



## **Bachelor of Accounting**

#### **Term 3, 2025 Commencing Student Advising Guide**

This Advising Guide has been specifically created for NEW students enrolling in a Bachelor of Accounting in Term 3, 2025 at Western Sydney University, Sydney City Campus.

This guide provides students with details of the Subjects they will need to study to complete their degree. It is divided into 2 sections

- 1. Course structure: Subjects divided into categories (e.g. Core, elective).
- 2. Subjects for 2025: Subjects for students to enrol in 2025.

#### Study load options

Fulltime study:	Students should select 3 Subjects per Term (International students are required to study a full-time load)
Part-time study:	Students should select 1-2 Subjects per Term
Accelerated study:	Students should select 4 Subjects per Term*

<sup>\*</sup>Students should only consider taking 4 Subjects per Term once they have completed at least one Term of study at Sydney City Campus.

#### Subject prerequisites and assumed knowledge

Students should check the handbook entry for more Subject information including perquisites, Subject levels and assumed knowledge.

#### **Advanced Standing**

Students who have received Advanced Standing for previous study should make sure they take into account which Subjects they have been granted credit for, before selecting their Subjects to study at Sydney City Campus.
